Regional Trail Acquisition in Highlands

It is wonderful to be able to report that a 15.6 hectare land donation for park as part of the amenity rezoning application for Section 74 has now been transferred to the CRD. The rezoning application was approved by Highlands Council in June 2012, and the land transfer just occurred in mid-November 2015 as the result of the completion of Phase 2 of the subdivision (portion at the end of Southwood Drive).

Regionally, the acquisition of the land contributes greatly to the completion of an East-West Trail Connector that goes from Gowlland Tod Provincial Park in the west to Thetis Lake Regional Park in the east. This trail connector continues to fulfill goals identified in both the CRD's Regional Parks Strategic Plan and the District's Trails Master Plan.

Highlands South Gateway Rezoning



OK INDUSTRIES' REZONING APPLICATION:

OK Industries acquired the parcel sandwiched between Millstream Industrial Park and Millstream Meadows in February 2015 from the Province. Their plan for the property – and thus rezoning application – is to use the gravel resources for approximately 20 to 35 years into the future, and then build a commercial/industrial business park in accordance with the District's Official Community Plan (OCP). This means initially extracting the gravel and processing it onsite primarily for use in their business operations. OK Industries is a full service asphalt and concrete contractor providing paving services throughout Vancouver Island. The planning consultant for the application has provided a concept plan that integrates transportation within all four of the industrial properties, shows a potential trail corridor, and potential areas to remain undisturbed. The proposal would see the majority of the site levelled to allow for proposed industrial uses.

Highlands Council has had preliminary discussion about the application, and has visited the site.

Background:

In the original Regional Growth Strategy, adopted in 2003, Highlands Council included four parcels of land, located on the east side of southernmost Millstream Road, within both the Urban Containment Boundary and the Regional Urban Containment and Servicing Policy Area. Two of the parcels, currently owned by Millstream Industrial Park and Tervita, were rezoned in 2004. An OCP designation of Commercial Industrial was assigned to the two larger parcels on the east side, now the subject of current rezoning applications. Highlands has never received property taxes from these two parcels before; the former Crown land (OK Industries) is now subject to taxation and the Millstream Meadows land will be upon sale in future.

MILLSTREAM MEADOWS:

"Millstream Meadows", located at 1965 Millstream Road, is a contaminated site in the process of remediation. It is owned by the CRD, and the region has spent \$9,000,000 to date remediating the site. Contamination was identified in 2007, and remediation is expected to be complete by 2020.

One of the reasons to remediate the site is to eventually allow the CRD to sell the property. Prior to selling it, the CRD wishes to rezone the property in alignment with the Highlands' Official Community Plan (OCP). The land is currently zoned Greenbelt 2 (GB2), and its OCP land use designation is Commercial Industrial. The property is within the Highlands Servicing Boundary, meaning that it can receive piped water and sewer services. Because the property's potential land use – as currently stated in the OCP – represents a higher potential use and value, the CRD would stand to gain financially in rezoning the property prior to sale. The main reason for this is to recoup some of the money spent by regional taxpayers on the remediation of the land.

Highlands Council has had preliminary discussion on the application and visited the site. Recent communication confirms that the CRD will pay all fees. The application is for industrial uses that are amenable to the District of Highlands with the ability for the property to apply for a Temporary Commercial or Industrial Use Permit, specifically to be able to process rock onsite.

"Temporary" in this instance means to a maximum of six years.

Current Status of Both Applications:

The applications are separate yet related. The concept plan provided by OK Industries presents a comprehensive idea for the potential future of Highlands' industrial area. OK Industries' request for long term onsite rock processing is not consistent with the OCP and the Integrated Community Sustainability Plan, while CRD's request for onsite rock processing by way of a Temporary Commercial or Industrial Permit is consistent with the OCP because the use would not be permanent. Council will retain a professional land use firm to help define the human, social, economic and natural capital costs and benefits of these proposed developments and recommend options to best meet Highlands' community values. Council will consider a consultant terms of reference in December 2015.

Council resolved at their November 16, 2015 Meeting:

- 1. That staff write the CRD and inquire how rock blasting, crushing and processing aligns with the 2018 remediation plan for the Millstream Meadows site.
- 2. That staff begin sourcing planning consulting services to assist with the management and processing of rezoning applications RZ-01-15 and RZ-02-15.
- 3. That staff bring back to Council, at the December 21 meeting, draft Terms of Reference regarding the above consulting services.

Winter Road Maintenance

During the winter season, Highland roads are inspected and maintained according to the road maintenance contract 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The contract establishes both minimum and maximum response times as well as establishing priorities for main roads, hills and school bus routes. The contractor is supervised by District staff on a daily/weekly basis depending on weather conditions.

The District's duty phone will once again be initiated on the first of December. This phone is monitored full time. Residents may report winter road conditions on this line. Action appropriate to circumstances will be taken. The phone number is 250-893-1773.

It is important to remind residents to not contact the District's Fire Chief to report road conditions or request winter maintenance. The Fire Chief does not have the authority to ask the roads contractor to respond, and these calls unnecessarily occupy his time.
