Council News

DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT DVP-01-09 AND COVENANTS

At its regular meeting on March 16th, Council has issued a development variance permit decreasing the building setback from 3 metres to 1.7 metres in order to allow a lot line to be created between existing buildings on the Brotherston property at 5247 Munn Road.

In December Council rezoned the property from one lot to three. Two of the proposed lots have existing residences and the third, containing the Gregory house and lean-to barn, is covenanted to restrict residential use.

A second covenant, which restricts modification, demolition or destruction of the existing farm house and barn for 5 years, was also approved by Council. The owners are also required to maintain the structures' integrity and prevent deterioration.

Council has placed the creation of a heritage policy on its strategic plan, and fully expects to have such a policy in place before the covenant expires.

RZ-01-08, 889 FINLAYSON ARM ROAD

Regarding a rezoning application for this nearly 30-acre property, Council had previously voiced concerns of hilltop protection, and the amenities being offered. On March 2nd, Council passed on further comments to the applicant regarding the proposed density, lack of consideration of park land dedication as commented on by the Langford Planning Department, and lack of protection against further subdivision.

RZ-03-08, 676 TAYLOR WAY

Council denied an application to rezone this property from one residential lot to three. Council had previously received a recommendation from the APC to deny the application. Council will be reviewing policy for large lot subdivisions (see Strategic Plan), which could provide applicants with guidelines for rezoning applications.

COMMUNITY-BASED

Council awaits committee recommendations regarding volunteer recognition.

A Sustainability Task Force has been established and will identify objectives.

The Community Task Force continues to seek a site and will hold a community hall design charette.

WEST SHORE PARKS AND RECREATION SOCIETY 2009 BUDGET

Council has not approved the 2009 budget pending a meeting of the owners for clarification on requests for capital funding contained in the 5-year plan. The Society has asked for over \$6 million to fund expansion projects, and has asked owners to discuss a plan to raise the funds.

2009 Strategic Plan Approved

Council has approved its 2009 Strategic Plan, earlier discussed at a Committee of the whole meeting February 21st. Items on the list of priorities include:

South Highlands Economic Development Discussions with property owners regarding land use and servicing issues

Water

Groundwater Monitoring Program

Roads

Annual road structure and surface assessments

Transportation

Participation in regional opportunities to enhance local transportation

Trails

An enhanced master plan is expected to be completed in the summer

Emergency Services

Council will support recruitment of H.E.L.P. volunteers. Review of issues relating to fire halls, communication with the fire department, and fire department staffing are underway.

Administration/Governance Council will continue to participate in the treaty process to the fullest extent possible, and develop and enhance relations with local First Nations governments.

Council will continue to support remediation of Millstream Meadows to the highest degree practicable

A report about Wildfire Interface Regulations is under preparation.

Draft revisions to the Subdivision Servicing Bylaw are underway and will come to Council.

Council will review soil deposit and removal regulations.

Council will create a heritage property policy, and consider policies for ethics, secondary housing, and large lots.
