It's an emergency! Can we find your address in the dark?

Calls for the Fire Department cover all sorts of emergencies from Medical Emergencies, Fires, Motor Vehicle Incidents, Downed Power Lines, Trail Rescues, Public Safety, and many more.

When we are responding to these emergencies, it's often at night and in poor weather conditions, and we are trying to find your address as quickly as possible!

Can we easily see it? Is it in the open near the road? Is it reflective? Are the colours visible in the dark? And can we see it from both directions?

Emergency personnel will have a difficult time finding you in the dark if you have an address sign that is not reflective or visible from BOTH directions. Precious minutes could be wasted as they try to find you on a dark road.

We encourage all residents to consider improving their signage by having high visibility reflective double-sided signs that can be seen coming from either direction.

Our Association is working with a supplier to prepare address signs that will make your home easier to find in all conditions. Our volunteer firefighters are happy to come to your residence and recommend an optimum sign solution for your location and we will also help with installation, if needed.

We will be offering a double-sided address marker to identify your house and driveway. The sign will cost \$65 and is to be installed into the ground via 2 steel posts, with contrasting reflective silver numbering on a blue background. These signs have proven to be highly visible in low light conditions. All net proceeds will be donated to Muscular Dystrophy Canada.

2024 District of Highlands Property Taxes and 2024 Home Owner Grants

Property tax notices will be mailed at the end of May with Property Taxes being due by July 2, 2024. Should you need to update your mailing address, please call the District Office at 250-474-1773 or email finance@highlands.ca as soon as possible.

Your Provincial Home Owner Grant must be claimed every year by July 2, 2024 to avoid penalties. Eligible property owners can apply for their grants on the Province's website at gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant or by calling toll-free to 1-888-355-2700 to speak with an agent.



2024 Provincial Speculation and Vacancy Tax

Please note that the **Provincial Speculation and Vacancy Tax Program** is different than the Provincial Homeowner Grant Program and that both need to be claimed separately.

Declaration letters were mailed in January by the Province. The declaration deadline is March 31, 2024. Every owner of a property must declare every year.

Backyard Burning

Please note that burn permits are required for ALL outdoor burning, campfires, incinerators etc: https://hvfd.burnpermits.com/



Before resorting to burning:

- Recycle through your local program or at a collection facility.
- Check what other disposal options are available for the material you want to burn.
- Compost instead of burning leaves and clippings.
- Hire tree trimming companies to dispose of land clearing debris.
- Woody material could be turned into wood chips, particle board, wood pellets, or fuel for cogeneration plants.
- Make sure the <u>weather and venting conditions</u> are appropriate for burning.
- Don't burn prohibited materials. More Information

Are You Bear Aware?

- Remove or secure attractants.
- Do not store garbage or other organic waste outdoors.
- If you have curbside collection, only put the containers out on the morning of collection day never the night before.



- Make sure recyclables have been cleaned.
- Pick fruit early and do not let windfall accumulate.
- Avoid feeding birds when bears are most active (April to November) and ensure birdfeeders are always inaccessible to non-target species such as squirrels and raccoons. Do not let seed that may attract rats and other rodents accumulate.
