Bob was instrumental in the incorporation of the District of Highlands in 1993, served as the District's very first Mayor and has received the honour of Freedom of the Municipality. He has demonstrated unparallelled dedication to community service and preservation of the natural environment before, during and after his



tenure as Mayor of the District of Highlands.

Bob has been a resident of the Highlands since 1953 and played a pivotal role in preserving the area's natural beauty amidst development pressures. He founded community associations, advocated for greenspace protection, and spearheaded initiatives like the Greater Victoria Greenbelt Society. His efforts led to Highlands incorporation as a separate municipality, ensuring its distinct character. He dedicated himself to conservation, contributing financially and orchestrating fundraising campaigns for projects like the WMÍYEŦEN Nature Sanctuary.

Bob remains committed to safeguarding the land, aiming to increase parkland and preserve the Highlands greenery for future generations.


