There were a lot of winners at the 2013 Highlands Fling, but perhaps the biggest was Anney's Closet.

Anney's Closet is the lead project of the Soroptimist International Victoria Westshore (SIVW) organization. It is aimed at connecting the needs of downsizing seniors with teen mothers in need of furnishings to establish a home for themselves and their babies.

The HDCA was able to provide a total of \$461.50 to Anney's Closet on the strength of considerable 50:50 contributions and the generosity of the Fling's Holisitic Healing clients and volunteers.


...A New Museum!
