You are invited to get involved and attend these important council meetings. We will be examining the financial details while doing our best to balance the cost of our plans against rising inflation pressures.


As the weather warms and we all emerge from the long cold winds of winter, council wishes you success in all your spring projects.



Please note that burn permits are required for ALL outdoor burning, campfires, incinerators etc:

- Recycle through your local program or at a collection facility.
- Check what other disposal options are available for the material you want to burn.
- Compost instead of burning leaves and clippings.
- Hire tree trimming companies to dispose of land clearing debris.
- Woody material could be turned into wood chips, particle board, wood pellets, or fuel for cogeneration plants.
- Make sure the weather and venting conditions are appropriate for

Community and Council News

2023 Property Taxes and Provincial Home Owner Grants

Property tax notices will be mailed at the end of May. Should you need to update your mailing address, please call the District Office at 250-474-1773 or email finance@highlands.ca as soon as possible.



Once you receive your tax notice, please claim your Provincial Home Owner Grant before the July 4th due date to avoid penalties. Eligible property owners can apply for their grants at gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant or by calling toll-free to 1-888-355-2700 to speak with an agent.

2023 Provincial Speculation and Vacancy Tax

Please note that the Provincial Speculation and Vacancy Tax program is separate from the Provincial Home Owner Grant program and that both must be claimed separately.

The speculation and vacancy tax declaration period is now open.

Declaration letters were mailed in January by the Province. You'll need your letter before you can declare on the Province's website at <u>gov.bc.ca/spectax</u>. Every owner of a property must <u>declare</u> every year. 99% of owners are exempt. The declaration deadline is March 31, 2023.

If a payment is owed, speculation and vacancy taxes are due July 4, 2023 to the Province.

Strategic Plan Update

Council has adopted its new <u>2023-2026 Strategic Plan</u>! The Plan will ensure that the priorities that are in progress from last Council term continue to move forward and will start conversations about how we can improve communications, as well as how we carry out our recreation services including looking at our trails and cycling network plans. It also will result in an organizational structure and capacity review to ensure the District's capacity and ability is in place to provide services that are progressive, effective, efficient, and strongly aligned with the direction of Council and the community. The 5 overarching goals and priorities of the Plan are:

- CLIMATE EMERGENCY, ADAPTATION & MITIGATION
- EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS, RESILIENCY & RECOVERY
- WATER RESOURCES & ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION
- RURAL VALUES, PROTECTION & ENHANCEMENT
- COMMUNITY WELL-BEING

South Highlands Local Area Plan (SHLAP)

At its February 21, 2023 Meeting, Council started discussions about the draft plan. The plan has been referred to a future Committee of the Whole Meeting to allow for public discussion. Some questions about the plan include: what kind of land uses would be acceptable in each of the proposed "Low-Impact Development" and "Environmental Stewardship" land use designations, and understanding definitions of "net positive" and "net zero" land use outcomes. These topics are discussed on pages 13, 18 and 21 of the draft plan in above web link.

Secondary Suite and ADU Project Update

Secondary suites and additional dwelling units remain unregulated in the Highlands. Council referred the project to the Sustainable Land Use Select Committee (SLUSC), who will discuss it at its March 2023 meeting. It is expected that SLUSC's recommendation and a staff report will go to Council in April or May.
