

# Loppers for loan

Thanks to the generosity of Home Hardware stores, 6 loppers have been donated to the HDCA and will be available for use by Highlands residents engaged in assisting with the Highlands broom cut on April  $30^{th}$  / May  $1^{st}$ . These compound action loppers are excellent at cutting the large broom branches off at the base of the plant while it is in bloom, the recommended strategy for eradication without disturbing seeds in the soil. Afterwards, they will be available for short term loan, first come, first served.
