

PROPERTY TAX INFORMATION

TAXES DUE: Wednesday July 2, 2025

PENALTIES: Unpaid property taxes (including unclaimed Home Owner Grants) are subject to penalties as follows: 5% if paid after July 2, 2025, and an additional 5% if paid after September 2, 2025.

PLAN AHEAD: Delays caused by postal service disruption will NOT exempt late payments from penalties.

PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT OPTIONS PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS IN PERSON District of Highlands Office Home Owner Grants cannot be processed at the District 1980 Millstream Rd Office. To avoid penalties, ensure you claim your Monday-Friday 8:30am to 4:00 pm excluding holidays Provincial Home Owner Grant by the annual tax due

(Cash/Cheque/Debit) CREDIT CARDS ARE NOT ACCEPTED

OR

at your Financial Institution

Bring your tax notice to the bank teller to make your payment.

ONLINE BANKING

Payee: Select "Highlands, Dist (BC) Taxes."

Account Number: Use your 11-digit jurisdiction and roll number (e.g., 36215912345) found on the front of your tax notice.

Ensure your payment is made before your financial institution's cut-off date for processing transactions.

The Property Tax Deferment program is a loans program available to eligible B.C. homeowners. It allows you to defer your current year property taxes.

BY MAIL or 24-HOUR MAILBOX

Mailing Address: District of Highlands, 1980 Millstream Rd, Victoria, BC, V9B 6H1.

Payments sent by mail must be received by the tax due date, as the Canada Post mark is no longer accepted as the received date.

Drop-off: Use the mailbox located at the front door of the District of Highlands Office. (Do not mail or drop off cash)

Instructions: Detach and include the bottom portion of your tax notice or write the folio (roll) number on the face of your cheque. Make cheques payable to: District of Highlands.

SPECULATION AND VACANCY TAX

The Provincial Speculation and Vacancy Tax is an annual tax based on how owners use residential properties in areas in B.C. affected most by the current housing shortage crisis.

Declaration letters are mailed in January. Each property owner must complete their declaration by March 31 every year.

MONTHLY PRE-AUTHORIZED PAYMENT PLAN

2025-2029 FIVE YEAR FINANICAL PLAN OVERVIEW

2025 Municipal Property Taxes

The municipal portion of the 2025 property taxes will increase by approximately \$143 for the average assessed property in the District of Highlands. This represents a combined 6.1% increase (4.1% general and fire taxes; 2% asset management). Following an update to the Asset Management Plan in late 2024, Council increased the asset management tax from 1% to 2% for the average homeowner.

Approximately 46% of the total tax revenue collected represents the municipal portion of the tax notice. The remaining revenue is collected on behalf of other taxing authorities such as the CRD, BC Transit, and the Province for School Taxes and Police Taxes.


The 2025 budget continues to support core services for the community and fund key projects and Council priorities. This includes ongoing Strategic Plan priorities.

The Financial Plan focuses on maintaining roads, roadside ditches, and culverts, and undertaking capital paving and culvert replacements.

Asset Management Levy

In 2019, an asset management levy was introduced to support community infrastructure renewal. This is identified as a separate line item on your tax notice so that residents can see what portion of your tax bill directly contributes to the District's asset management.

This levy is intended to help the District of Highlands reach sustainable funding levels over time which will ensure that Highlands' roads, facilities and other infrastructure is replaced or maintained well into the future.
